

Alphabet Game

Impact: Listening, communication, focus, and fun

Risk: Low

Group Size: 10 per group maximum

Time Required: 10 – 15 minutes

Directions:

- Gather group members in a circle and decide who the head of the circle will be.
- The head of the circle then says one word that begins with the letter "A."
- The person to the head's right then states the word previously given and adds word starting with the letter "B."
- This routine of repeating the previous words then adding a new word that begins with the following alphabetical letter continues around the circle.

Option:

- Try to get members to use words that revolve around the workshop theme or organization's work, e.g. vegetables, volunteer work, etc.
- Start with a statement such as, "I'm going to a town council meeting and along the way I will meet ..."
- Choose a category, such as movies or cars.

Discussion:

How important is it to listen to those around you? How important is it to pay attention when someone else is speaking.
